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### RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Adopt Resolution No. 2014-29, a Resolution of the Town Council of the Town of Apple Valley, California, approving the Sanitary Sewer Management Plan (SSMP) update for the Town of Apple Valley as required by the State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 2006-0003 Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems.

### SUMMARY:

On May 2, 2006, the California State Water Resources Control Board adopted Order No. 2006-0003, Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Systems (WDR). The WDR is the regulatory mechanism for all agencies that own or operate sanitary sewer collection systems greater than one mile in length that collect and/or convey untreated or partially treated wastewater to a publicly owned treatment facility. The ultimate goal of the WDR is to reduce the frequency and volume of sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) by requiring agencies to properly operate, maintain, and manage their wastewater collection system.

The final SSMP document in its entirety must be approved by the agency's governing board by the required completion date of July 28, 2014. The collective document including all elements has been completed and is ready for approval by the Town

Council. If approved, the final SSMP will be authorized for online certification in time for the July 28, 2014 deadline.

A complete copy of the Final SSMP is available for viewing in the Town Clerk's office.

**BACKGROUND:**

According to the WDR, each agency was required to develop and implement a system-specific Sewer System Management Plan (SSMP) which includes 11 separate elements. Staff completed the first SSMP July 28, 2009 and it was approved by council at that time and submitted to the State Water Resources Control Board. The Town is required to audit the SSMP every two years and the audits were completed in 2011 and 2013. The SSMP is required to be updated every 5 years to include current cleaning logs, sewer service area maps, closed circuit TV inspection (CCTV) logs, sewer lift station information, sewer system overflow information, contact information for key Wastewater staff and various other elements. This updated information is included in the July, 2014 SSMP. The next time the Town will need to update the SSMP is in 2019.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2014-29**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE SANITARY SEWER MANAGEMENT PLAN (SSMP) UPDATE FOR THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY AS REQUIRED BY THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD ORDER NO. 2006-0003 STATEWIDE GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMS.**

**WHEREAS**, on May 2, 2006, the State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 2006-0003 – Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) for Sanitary Sewer Systems was adopted and implemented; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the WDR is to develop a regulatory mechanism to provide a consistent statewide approach for reducing sanitary sewer overflows; and

**WHEREAS**, the WDR requires preparation of a Sewer System Management Plan (SSMP) with 11 separate elements; and

**WHEREAS**, the original SSMP was first approved by council in 2009 and is required to be updated every 5 years; and

**WHEREAS**, the final SSMP must be approved by the agency's governing board for certification upon its completion.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town Council of the Town of Apple Valley, California, finds, determines and orders as follows:

**Section 1.** Approves the SSMP update as required by the State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 2006-0003 Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems.
