#### RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Town Council:

- 1. Conduct the required public hearing; and
- 2. Adopt the attached Resolution No. 2014-45 accepting the COPS grant in the amount of \$111,737.00 and authorize the allocation of the FY 2014-15 Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Funds (SLESF) to supplement the Juvenile Officer positions.

#### SUMMARY:

The State of California (State) has provided supplemental funding to local law enforcement agencies through continuation of funding for the Citizen's Option for Public Safety (COPS) Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Fund (SLESF) grant program. These funds are distributed by the State to the County which passes through the funding to local agencies proportionally based on population. However, each agency is to be allocated a minimum of \$100,000.00.

In order to receive COPS funds, the Town Council is required to hold a public hearing to consider the requested use of the funds pursuant to Government Code Section 30061(c). Upon closure of the public hearing, the Town Council must then authorize the acceptance and use of the funds.

Each year, these funds have been used to supplement the Juvenile Officer position which was added as a result of the initial grant program. Staff again is recommending that Town Council authorize the acceptance and use of the COPS funds to supplement the Juvenile Officer position. This year, the Town of Apple Valley (Town) is scheduled to

receive \$111,737.00 plus interest, which is a 0.57% decrease from last year's allocation of \$112,380.00. In addition, the Town just received a "growth" payment for the FY 2013-14 COPs program in the amount of \$7,001.00. The 2014-15 allocation will provide sufficient funding for the continuation of the existing program.

The attached Resolution No. 2014-45 will implement the recommended action accepting the COPS grant in the amount of \$111,737.00 and authorizing the allocation of the funds to the FY 2014-15 Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Funds (SLESF) to supplement the Juvenile Officer position.

# **ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:**

No alternatives were considered.

#### **FISCAL REVIEW:**

Pursuant to the COPS Grant Agreement, the Town will receive \$111,737.00 in FY 2014-15, which is a 0.57% decrease from the level of funding awarded in FY 2013-2014. All funds received pursuant to this grant are proposed to be allocated to supplement the Juvenile Office position.

#### **LEGAL REVIEW:**

The attached resolution has been reviewed and approved as to form.

# **CONCLUSION:**

Staff recommends that the Town Council conduct the required public hearing and adopt the attached Resolution No. 2014-45 to formally receive the grant and appropriate the FY 2014-15 Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Funds (SLESF) to supplement the Juvenile Officer position.

#### **RESOLUTION NO 2014-45**

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE ALLOCATION OF FY 2014-2015 SUPPLEMENTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICE FUNDS (SLESF) TO SUPPLEMENT FUNDING FOR THE JUVENILE OFFICER POSITIONS

**WHEREAS**, the State of California has extended legislation providing for Supplemental Law Enforcement Service Funds (SLESF) for the Citizens Option for Public Safety (COPS) program; and

**WHEREAS**, the funds are to be used to supplement front line municipal police services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Police Chief recommends that SLESF funds for FY 2014-2015 be used to supplement funding for the juvenile officer positions; and

**WHEREAS,** a public hearing was held on November 18, 2014, regarding the use of SLESF funds for FY 2014-2015.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town Council hereby authorizes the allocation of FY 2014-2015 Supplemental Law Enforcement Service Funds in the estimated amount of \$111,737.00 plus interest to supplement funding for the juvenile officer position.

Dear Controller Chiang:

Pursuant to Government Code section 30029.05, subdivision (e), paragraph (2), the Department of Finance respectfully submits the attached (Attachments I and II) percentages for the allocation of 2014-15 Citizens' Option for Public Safety (COPS) and the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) funds deposited in the Enhancing Law Enforcement Activities Subaccount (ELEAS) in the Law Enforcement Services Account within the Local Revenue Fund 2011.

Pursuant to Government Code section 30061, subdivisions (b) and (g), subsequent to the allocation described in subdivision (d) of Section 29552, 47.08727192 percent of the remaining funds deposited in the ELEAS for the COPS (23.54363596 percent) and JJCPA (23.54363596 percent) programs are to be allocated, according to the relative population for each county and city, as follows:

- (1) 5.15 percent to the county sheriff for county jail construction and operation.
- (2) 5.15 percent to the district attorney for criminal prosecution.
- (3) 50 percent to the county or city and county to implement a comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan.
- (4) 39.7 percent to the county and the cities within the county for front-line law enforcement. Note that pursuant to Government Code section 30061, subdivision (b), paragraph (3), each law enforcement jurisdiction receiving front-line law enforcement funding is to receive a minimum grant of \$100,000. The percentages included in Attachment II are calculated in a manner that provides for a minimum grant allocation of \$100,000 to each law enforcement jurisdiction listed in Attachment II.

Note that the by-county percentages for the first three allocations above: (1) county jail construction, (2) district attorney criminal prosecution, and (3) multi-agency juvenile justice plans, are specified on Attachment I and the by-county/city percentages for the fourth allocation, front-line law enforcement, are identified on Attachment II. Also note that the allocations shown on Attachments I and II may be slightly different from the final allocations made by the State Controller's Office due to rounding.
