GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR TRANSPORTATION PERMIT

1. ACCEPTANCE OF PERMIT

Acceptance of this permit constitutes an agreement by the Permittee to observe and comply with all of the general and specific conditions on the face of the permit and attachments thereto.

The use of this permit is prima facie evidence that the driver has checked the load and/or vehicle and knows it to be within the limits as set forth hereon and has verified the routing accuracy. The vehicle and/or load authorized under this permit are subject to inspection by representatives of the Town Engineering Department and costs of such inspection shall be borne by the Permittee.

2. REGISTRATION AND LICENSE PLATES

All hauling units must be duly registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles as required by law, and that all special Mobile Equipment must carry a valid identification plate.

3. PROHIBITED MOVING HOURS

This permit is effective within the period stated on the face of the permit. Unless specifically stated otherwise:

No moving during fog or rain and the following holidays:

Fourth of July
Christmas

Labor Day
New Years Day

Thanksgiving Day
Memorial Day

Special permission may be granted to move during the above prohibited periods provided such moves are necessitated by emergencies or by other valid reasons and provided that such special permission is cited on the permit or amendments thereto.

No changing of the dates on permits will be allowed. If move is cancelled due to inclement weather, a new permit will be issued free of charge.

4. SAFETY OF OTHER TRAFFIC

The Permittee shall at all times provide for the safety of the public when the vehicle under permit disrupts the normal traffic pattern and flow within the travelled way. He shall provide flagmen, signs, warning lights or other safety devices as necessary to give the public ample warning of such description and to safely route the traffic through or around the congested area.

5. ESCORTS OR PILOT CARS

Front escorts shall be required for loads or vehicles over 12 feet in width and both front and rear escorts shall be required for loads over 14 feet in width.

Signs shall be posted on front and rear and shall read "OVERSIZE LOAD", "WIDE LOAD" or "LONG LOAD", or as appropriate for front or rear overhang. The "OVERSIZE LOAD" sign shall have preference when a combination of features exists. The lettering shall be a 10 inch minimum height with a 2 inch minimum brush stroke and a minimum of 1 inch border all around. All signs shall be black letters on a yellow background mounted at least 18 inches above the road surface front and rear. Signs must be neat, clean, legible, mounted securely and visible from straight ahead or behind and to 45 degree each side thereof. All signs must be illuminated for night moves, or be constructed of suitable reflectorized material to be clearly visible to approaching traffic.

6. HEIGHT

When an over-height load is authorized, (over 14 feet), the Permittee shall check all underpasses, bridges, overhead wires and other limiting structures or facilities for adequate clearance.

7. EXCESSIVE HEIGHT

When the vertical height is 20 feet and over, no permit shall be issued until clearances have been received from the Fire Department, Power Company and Telephone Company.

8. OVERHEAD POWER AND TELEPHONE CABLES

The Permittee shall notify the owners of all overhead lines or structures subject to disturbance or damage by his move and shall make arrangements for the temporary removal or relocation of the conflicting facility if required.

9. CARE OF TREES

No trees shall be cut, trimmed or in any way damaged.

10. STOPPING AT NIGHT

No vehicle or load being moved shall be parked overnight on a Town Street, alley or public property without permission being expressly given and so indicated on the permit.

11. NIGHT MOVES

Any load moved during night-time hours shall meet all requirements of the Town of Apple Valley regulations and shall be properly lighted with warning lights and signs as may be required by law and ordinance.

12. STALLED

If an over-width load, because of emergency or breakdown, is forced to park on a Town street, the Permittee shall immediately notify the Police Department, the Fire District, and the Town Engineer, and shall take all necessary action to effect the earliest possible removal from the street. He shall display such lights, flags, signals or other traffic warning devices as necessary and shall take all necessary precautions to protect the pavement from prolonged overloading.

13. PROTECTION ON BRIDGES AND NARROW ROADS

When crossing bridges or on roads so narrow that there is insufficient room for traffic to travel in both directions with reasonable safety, flagmen shall be posted ahead of and behind the equipment to warn and direct approaching traffic.

14. RESPONSIBILITY FOR BRIDGES

This permit does not authorize crossing any posted bridges with gross load exceeding posted limits unless specifically mentioned on the face of this permit. Permittee shall comply with all rules posted on any bridges over which he shall pass and shall assume all risks relative thereto.

15. PERMIT SUBJECT TO INSPECTION

The permit and conditions must be carried on the equipment or structure at all times while it is being moved within the highway limits. The permit shall be submitted for inspection on demand of any law enforcement officer or any authorized agent of the Town of Apple Valley.

16. LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE

The Permittee is responsible for all liability for personal injury or property damage which may occur through any act or omission of the Permittee when acting under the terms of this permit. In the event any claim is made against the Town of Apple Valley or any

Department, officer or employee thereof, through, by reason of, or in connection with any such act or omission, Permittee shall defend, indemnify, and hold them and each of them harmless from such claim.

17. REPAIR OF DAMAGE

In accepting a permit, the Permittee agrees to repair at his own expense and to the satisfaction of the Town Engineer any damage to the Town streets or structures. Work of repair may be done by the Public Works Department forces at the option of the Town Engineer. The cost is to be borne by the Permittee. In the event of damage to Town street facilities such as bridges, traffic signals, light standards and so forth, a written report must be filed with the Town Engineer as soon as practical after such damage has been done and in any event within 24 hours after such damage has been done. Failure to make this report will be considered cause for cancellation of all permit privileges pending a satisfactory arrangement with the Town Engineer for repair or replacement of the damaged facility. Damage to property outside of street rights-of-way shall also be reported to the Town Engineer and to the owner of the party affected.

18. TRIP LIMIT

Unless specifically stated on the face of the permit, a permit is good for only one trip between the points designated.

19. PARKING ON STREET

If necessary to park equipment on the Town streets at night, it shall be moved off the pavement so as not to interfere with passing traffic in any way. Warning lights shall be displayed so as to fully protect said traffic.

20. ROUTINGS

Town Engineer will designate street routings for moves not compatible with existing street width and geometric design.

21. KIND OF EQUIPMENT

Buildings are to be moved with regular house moving equipment.

22. CLEANING UP RIGHT-OF-WAY

Upon completion of the moving work, all timbers and equipment shall be removed and the right-of-way left in the same condition as before the work started.

23. DO NOT DISTURB ROADWAY SURFACE

No wedge, bar, or spike shall be driven in the surface of any dedicated Public Right-of-Way.

24. VOID PERMIT

This permit is null and void and hereby declared non-existent if:

- a) any portion, part or section is illegible,
- b) it is not signed by an authorized representative of the Town of Apple Valley,
- c) any portion, part or section has been altered or if an attempt to alter is apparent,
- d) it is presented without the attachments affixed that are, specifically, named and required upon the face of the permit.
