#### NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN UP



Code Enforcement conducted a Neighborhood Clean-Up at Dale Evans Pkwy & Otoe on Saturday February 21, 2015 between the hours of 9:00am and 3:00pm. During that time 74 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 21 tons of trash & debris and .95 tons of recyclables. Thirteen containers were utilized from Burrtec to collect the trash & debris and recyclables. Prior to the event, staff walked a designated area notifying residents of the upcoming clean up by handing out flyers. These events are grant funded and allow residents to remove potential blight issues voluntarily.





88% of the graffiti cases opened in February were opened proactively by officers.













## **COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM**

The Community **Enhancement Crew** consists of one part-time Community Enhancement Officer and multiple work release inmates from the San Bernardino County Jail. The Community **Enhancement Crew** removes illegal dumps from the desert when Code Officers cannot locate the individual(s) who dumped the items. They also assist with community enhancement events, Public Works, household hazardous waste and other functions throughout the town. The crew works on Saturday and Sunday.

15,240 pounds of trash and debris was collected in February.











#### CODE ENFORCEMENT SPOTLIGHT



On February 4, 2015, Code Enforcement was requested by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Marijuana Eradication Team to respond to the 13900 block of Pioneer for potential violations. When officers arrived they observed four separate units, each being used to house individual marijuana grows. The four units had substantial construction within each of the units used for growing marijuana. It was determined by Officers that construction was completed without required permits from Building and Safety. The additions including electrical wiring, plumbing and ventilation were determined to be potentially hazardous. Due to the potentially unsafe environment they posed, the buildings were deemed to be unsafe for human occupancy. Officers issued citations to the occupants and property owner for the building related violations and operation of a marijuana dispensary. Officers posted the suites as uninhabitable.

Although Code Enforcement is proactive in searching for municipal code violations, 78 square miles is a large area to cover, and Code Enforcement Officers will not see everything. When filing a complaint, your name, address and phone number are required. This information remains confidential and is used only for the Code Enforcement Officer to contact you for additional information or to update you on the case.
