#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Bill Holland, Mayor Pro Tem, City of Hesperia, pledged his support to the Town of Apple Valley in its quest to provide optimal service to its residents through water services.

Logan Olds, General Manager, Victor Valley Water Reclamation Authority, announced that a grant award was just received for \$9,181,841.00 to the Town of Apple Valley for its subregional plant. He stated that this grant would cover approximately thirty percent (30%) of the total project cost.

Regina Weatherspoon-Bell, Field Representative for Supervisor Robert Lovingood, briefed the Town Council and the public on the status of the Apple Valley Library. She spoke of the structural damage that has occurred in the building and indicated that the most recent proposal for repairs had indicated that further evaluation and repairs would probably take several months with an anticipated re-opening date in late June 2016. She stated that the County of San Bernardino would be providing a bookmobile van in the next few months for the community. She indicated that the van would provide books, but not computer and/or copy services.

Rusty Green, Board Member, Sun City Apple Valley, thanked the Town Council for their assistance in getting the stop signs located in the Sun City neighborhood.

Salvador Ortiz, Apple Valley, believed that he had been unfairly targeted by members of the Apple Valley staff when attempting to conduct business in the community.

# PULLED FOR DISCUSSION

5. Adopt Resolution No. 2015-41, a Resolution of the Town Council of the Town of Apple Valley Supporting the California Minerals, Off-Road Recreation and Conservation Act

Jim Conkle, Victorville, recommended approval of the continued support of the Desert Conservation Plan.

April Sall, Citizen, recommended the Town continue the pledged support of the Desert Conservation Plan. She recommended that the Town Council continue this item until an appropriate companion bill is developed.

Kevin Chang, Field Representative for Senator Dianne Feinstein, spoke of the discussions with Representative Paul Cook in an effort to establish a joint bill that would be agreed upon by both parties. He spoke of the differences in the bills and encouraged the Town Council to continue its support of the Desert Conservation Act.

Dakota Higgins, Field Representative for Congressman Paul Cook, urged the Town Council to support Resolution No. 2015-41. He clearly outlined the reasons why the bill should be supported listing the benefits that the bill would bring to the high desert region.

Bill Holland, Hesperia, believed that there were more similarities in the two (2) bills than differences and urged the Town Council to support the bill presented by Congressman Cook. He explained the difficulty with the Antiquities Act stating the reasons why the act is not beneficial for the community. He believed it was appropriate for the Town to support the efforts of both Senator Feinstein and Congressman Cook.

Discussion ensued regarding Town Council's thoughts on the Antiquities Act, and hope that Senator Feinstein and Congressman Cook's offices would be able to come together to work out the differences between their two (2) conservation bills. The Town Council also commented that one of the most important issues is protecting and preserving our desert.

Council Member Nassif noted, with the consensus of the Town Council, that support of this bill did not affect the support of the bill presented by Senator Feinstein that was previously supported by the Town Council through adoption of Resolution No. 2015-10. **MOTION** 

Motion by Council Member Bishop, seconded by Council Member Emick, to adopt the attached Resolution No 2015-41, a Resolution of the Town of Apple Valley in support of The California Minerals, Off-Road Recreation and Conservation Act.
