

# **HEART GAMES** Returns to Civic Center Park

This annual event is an exciting opportunity for residents to enjoy a fun competition while getting their heartrate up. There are 10 fun checkpoints scattered across Civic Center Park, designed to accommodate all age groups and athletic ability.

"This event has grown exponentially every year," said Heart Games Coordinator, Lena Quinonez. "All the teams dress up and the costumes get more and more creative. During the opening ceremonies the competitors often engage in some good-natured banter about who is going to win; but when they hit the park, it's all just good, healthy fun." Past checkpoints had participants dress up in a full firemen's suit, then use a hose to try and knock down a cone; or guess how many calories are in a meal from your favorite fast food chain; and many more creative ways to get moving and learn healthy habits.

While the goal of the event is to get people out and moving, it is also designed to make new friendships and learn how to keep a healthy strong heart.

"Some of our kids teams started with us when they were in elementary and are now returning as middle school teams," said Lena. "We also have groups of parents and kids that compete fiercely against each other. It's the lively team spirit that makes the event so great!"

At the Heart Games, the first team back isn't necessarily the winner. Teams have opportunities throughout the park to collect extra points and the team with the most points at the end of the game wins!


# Give Life at the LIFESTREAM BLOOD BRIVE

It is easy to save a life and only takes a few minutes when you participate in a LifeStream Blood Drive. The Town of Apple Valley's spring blood drive will be held March 15 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Conference Center.

Nationally, 37% of the population is eligible to give blood. Locally, in Southern California, only 3% do. Let's turn that around in Apple Valley. Healthy individuals at least 15 years of age may donate blood. Those 15 and 16 years of age must provide LifeStream with written parental consent, available at www.lstream.org/BloodDonationFact. aspx, or from any donor center or blood drive. All prospective donors should be free of infections or illness, weigh at least 110 pounds, and not be at risk for AIDS or hepatitis. Donors receive a free mini-physical as part of the donation process. Donating blood takes about an hour, yet gives someone a lifetime.

# **BOOKMOBILE** Rolls Into Town Hall for Readers' Convenience

Responding to the outpouring of patron concern over the extended closure of the Newton T. Bass Branch Library, San Bernardino County officials resumed serving readers in North Apple Valley with its Adventure Bus Bookmobile. The mobile lending library will be available from 2 to 5 p.m. every Tuesday outside of the closed branch located at 14901 Dale Evans Parkway.

Services provided through the bookmobile include obtaining a library card, checking out materials, returning or renewing materials and requesting materials from other county library branches. Services also remain available at the Victor Valley Museum at 11873 Apple Valley Road. Library hours at the museum are 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Wednesday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday.

The latest information from the county indicates that summer of 2016 is the soonest we could see the facility reopen. Contact the Victor Valley Museum at (760) 240-2111 for more information.

# Town Takes Steps to Acquire WATER SYSTEN

In light of ongoing and exorbitant rate increases, and the inability to negotiate a purchase, the Town Council has taken steps to move forward with eminent domain proceedings to acquire the Apple Valley Water System. Since 2002, the average water bill for AVR customers has jumped by 68 percent, and the new year will bring another 25.58%, or \$200/year, for the average water user.

According to a report from the California State Auditor, Apple Valley residents in 2014 paid nearly 54 percent more for water than did residents in Victorville,

and 67 percent more than residents in Hesperia. Both of those water systems are publicly owned, as are the vast majority in California and around the country.

In the meantime, public support within Apple Valley has been growing in favor of acquisition. In July, polling by True North

Research showed that 70 percent of Apple Valley Ranchos ratepayers support acquisition.

The Town of Apple Valley is looking for qualified applicants to hire as lifeguards for the summer. Applicants must be trained and certified by the time of their interview, or provide proof of enrollment in the Lifeguard Training course offered in March. Employment applications will be available at Town Hall the week of March 7. Lifeguard Training registration is open now.

#### LIFEGUARD TRAINING

The knowledge and skills taught in this course will provide everything participants need to keep themselves and others safe in and around any aquatic environment. The course covers rescue skills, CPR/AED, first aid, emergency childbirth, and major trauma emergencies. Successful completion of this course is required for all who seek employment as a lifeguard at the Civic Center Park Aquatic Center. All participants must pass the pre-swim in order to continue the course. The course fee is \$200. Refunds will be given for participants who fail to complete the pre-swim.

Groundwater to Be Next Topic for ABC'S OF WATER

How much water does the High Desert have in its "water bank account"? Senior Hydrogeologist Tony Winkel and Principal Hydrogeologist Anna Garcia will discuss the water balance of the High Desert when he presents "Groundwater - Dynamics of the Local Water Supply," at the next "ABC's of Water." The session will be held Tuesday, March 22 from 5:30 to 7 p.m. at the Mojave Water Agency.

The Upper Mojave River Groundwater Basin is the essential water resource for the Victor Valley. It's like a checking account; when we deposit, our balance goes up. You will learn how the Mojave River and the surrounding aquifer systems dynamically interact and affect one another in our water bank account.

### VETERANS' AID & ATTENDANCE PENSION PROGRAM

### Are you a Veteran or Surviving Spouse?

The VA designed this program to help Veterans and their surviving spouses receive the financial support necessary to ensure their continuing care in an Assisted Living setting. The pension with the additional benefit of Aid and Attendance can provide up to \$1,788.00 for a veteran, \$1,149.00 per month to a surviving spouse, \$2,120.00 to a married veteran, or \$2,837.00 per month to a veteran couple.

#### Eligibility Requirements

- 90 days of active duty, with a least one day served during a time of war.
- Assets must be less than \$80,000. (Assets do not include your personal residence, car).
- Financial need in general, there must be less income yearly than the cost of care provided.

Veteran must have served at least • Medical diagnosis - You must have a medical condition indicating that you are in need of assistance from others in order to live a quality life. including, but not limited to the following:

- Walking Bathing
- Dressing Medical Assistance
- Assistance w/personal hygiene
- Transferring from bed or chair

# Funds Available for HOME REPAIRS

Is your roof in disrepair? Do you need windows with better insulation? Can't afford the repairs? The Town of Apple Valley might be able to help. Low income residents who already own a home may qualify for up to \$20,000 for eligible repairs through the Residential Rehabilitation (RRLP) and \$10,000 through the Manufactured Home Repair (MHRP) loan program.

The RRLP and MHRP provide eligible Apple Valley residents with 0% interest, deferred loans with no monthly payments to repair single-family, owner-occupied homes. Eligible improvements include addressing code violations, painting, roofing, plumbing, heating, cooling, damaged ceilings and walls, as well as other health and safety items. The program can also be used for energy conservation and accessibility improvements. Freestanding appliances, room additions, and luxury items such as patios, pools and spas are not eligible.

Local contractors who would like to be put on the bid list for this program are encouraged to go through the simple pre-qualification process. Contractor requirements include a valid state contractor's license, business license and proof of insurance.

# Teens Get a Look at Local

Should Apple Valley spend money to offer free e-waste pick-up for seniors? Should the Town provide 100 free microchips to pets of senior citizens? How beneficial is it to provide swim lessons for low-income/at-risk youth? These are some of the issues more than 30 local teens debated at the town's Second Annual Mayor's Youth Leadership Conference last November.

Juniors and seniors from five Apple Valley high school programs were invited to participate in the all-day event that included presentations from department managers, lunch with the mayor, as well as information on volunteer and internship opportunities. The day culminated with a mock town council meeting where student groups presented proposals for projects to address a variety of issues. Those students selected to serve on the mock council deliberated on how they should spend \$1,000.

The final decision was to allocate \$1,000 to a campaign that encourages students and their families to shop local in order to grow tax revenues, retail profits and ultimately create more local jobs. The item was then approved by the elected Town Council at the regular December meeting. Town staff will work with the winning team over the coming months to implement the proposal.

## Low Cost PET VACCINE CLINICS

There are few better ways to show your pet you love them than to keep them current on their vaccines. Apple Valley Animal Services partners with local veterinary hospitals to offer low-cost vaccines several times a year at the shelter from 5 to 7 p.m.

Rabies vaccines are available for dogs or cats for \$6. Additional vaccines available for dogs are Bordetella for \$10 and DA2PP for \$15. The feline leukemia vaccine will be offered for \$15. # World Record Attempt at the **10TH ANNUAL PET FAIR**

Norman Vincent Peale once said, "Shoot for the moon...even if you miss you will land among the stars." This famous quote is a perfect way to describe Apple Valley Animal Services' attempt to break a world record at their 10th Annual Paws N' Claws Pet Fair last October. They came up short on the record, but it wasn't for lack of enthusiasm!

"We wanted to do something big to commemorate our 10th event," explained Animal Services Director Gina Schwin-Whiteside. "What better way to do that than to try and break a world record."

Nearly 300 people and their pets gathered at Civic Center Park under the watchful eye of an official Guinness Book of World Records judge. Each participant was given a bag of doggy treats and a designated section of the fenced off lawn area to stand in. Jason Rae from Inside Out Dog Training conducted a 30-minute obedience lesson that included instructions on how to get a pet to respond to a command with positive reinforcement.

The goal of the effort was to illustrate that even just a little bit of training can make the difference between a well-behaved pet and an unwanted animal that gets turned into the shelter.

"The session was a complete success," said Schwin-Whiteside. "We helped many owners and their dogs learn new obedience techniques they can use to ensure their pets have a long and happy life in a positive environment."

The Paws N' Claws Pet Fair is an annual event that began as a small open house, progressed to Lion's Park and has now expanded to Civic Center Park where it has become one of the largest animal-related events in the High Desert.
