## 3. Request to dedicate memorial plaque in honor of Ryan Cambridge at the base of the golf course flag pole

Parks and Recreation Manager, Wright, brought forward a request by the Ryan Cambridge Golf Committee to install a memorial plaque and dedicate the golf course flag pole in honor of Ryan Cambridge, co-owner of Conco Construction who was killed in a tragic construction accident in 2005. The Ryan Cambridge Memorial Golf Committee will be hosting a memorial golf tournament in honor of Ryan Cambridge on October 11<sup>th</sup>. This will be the 10<sup>th</sup> annual tournament.

Mr. Wright stated that in accordance with the adopted Recognition and Memorial Plaques policy, the requesting party would be required to pay all costs of the installation and that the Town had a surplus 45' flag pole that could replace the existing flag pole.

Chairman Martin stated that this would be a positive improvement to the facility and the Commission concurred.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith and seconded by Commissioner Tatera to approve the request. The motion was carried 3-0-0-2

### 4. Approval of Minutes for Park and Recreation Commission Meeting

A motion was made by Commissioner Tatera and seconded by Commissioner Smith to approve the minutes for the meeting of June 4, 2015. The motion carried by a 3-0-0-2 vote.

### PARKS AND RECREATION MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Wright discussed the following activities:

After School Activities Program(ASAP) – The ASAP program has a waiting list at all but one of the school sites even after the Town had expanded the capacity at three of its sites. Dedicated space on the school campuses continues to be a struggle and staff is working to increase capacity to accommodate those on the waiting list.

Day Camp – Had the highest attendance in years. Staff received many positive comments on the improved program. There was an average of 50 participants per week.

Aquatic Center – Programming in the Aquatic Center continued its strong summer with recreation swim participation up 28% over last year. The addition of the water slide is a positive contributing factor. Group, private and semi-private swim lessons increased by more than 10% as well.

Recreation Coordinator Alicia Dannelley – was honored on September 12<sup>th</sup> as part of Congressman Cook's Salute to Women honorees for her work as a mentor in the community.

Fall Recreation Brochure was delivered to the community.

## 1. Approval of Minutes for Park and Recreation Commission Meeting

It was the consensus of the Commission to table the approval of the minutes of the August 6, 2015 and September 3, 2015 until the next regularly scheduled Commission meeting.

### 2. Approval of Parks and Recreation Division Monthly Report

Motion by Vice-Chairman Patrick Doran, seconded by Commissioner Smith to approve the monthly reports for May, June, July and August 2015. Motion carried by a 3-0-0-2 vote.

## 3. Report on Teen Programming Recommendation:

Recreation Coordinator, Alicia Dannelley, updated the commission on teen programming including the Teen Zone program that she has organized. She spoke in detail about the program's teen volunteers. She explained that she has had a tremendous increase in participants with 6 still on the waiting list. She discussed that they volunteer in the

community and how they have a competition for the most hours completed. They will be starting a point system and hope to have a store soon so the volunteers can purchase items with the points that they earn. They also recognize the volunteer with the most hours at the Town Council meetings.

Chairman Mike Martin said that he thinks it is a terrific program and that he had been at some of the events that the Teen Zone had volunteered at. He said that he was happy to see them helping the community and glad to hear of the programs' success.

## 4. Report on the Civic Center Aquatic Center and the Instructor Class program Recommendation:

Recreation Coordinator, Andy Shoup updated the commission on the 2015 summer aquatics program. His report included participation numbers, highlights of events and accolades to the staff. Recreation Coordinator Shoup also reported on the instructor class program area, discussing the Town's vast array of offerings for toddlers through our senior population. He spoke on the success of the numerous fitness and preschool age classes. He also discussed the partnerships with private agencies like 360 gymnastics and the Bullet Hole gym.

Commissioner Smith congratulated Mr. Shoup on the extensive programs offered and the professionalism that the aquatic's staff presents to the community.

Commissioner Tatera commented on his use of the Aquatic Center and of how much he has personally enjoyed the facility.

### 5. Park Project Updates

Mr. Wright updated the Commission on projects scheduled to be completed this Fiscal year, including installation of new doors at James Woody Community Center, potential lighting project for the mini-gym and gymnasium at James Woody, and active use amenities at Mendel Park.

Mr. Wright also discussed the CDBG application window for the 2016-17 CDBG funding cycle and the installation of a restroom at Thunderbird Park.

Chairman Martin commented that all of the projects would be great improvements for the park system. It was the consensus of the Commission to continue with the projects as discussed.

### PARKS AND RECREATION MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr Wright updated the Commission on a number of recently completed programs and future programming. Included in the discussion was the Recreation Department's participation in the parade and the Tour De Victor Valley, the continued success of the day camp program and Recreation Coordinator, Alicia Dannelley being selected by Congressman Cook in his Salute to Women program as a Mentor in the community.

Mr Wright also informed the Commission of upcoming programs including Santa in the Park, Cocoa and Carols, Gingerbread build, the Winter Wonderland event and Apple Valley's Most Talented Kid.

Chairman Martin congratulated the Recreation Department for the continued exemplary work and commented on the success of the Village Parade.

### **SUMMARY:**

The Recreation Department consistently evaluates the program fees to ensure the adopted fee is properly designed to cover the associated costs of each program. Due to seasonal staffing cost increases, there is a need to propose a fee increase for those programs with large on site staffing requirements. The slight fee increases to our youth sports programs, the 5k/10k runs and our After School Activities Program(ASAP) are reasonable and will allow us to recover direct variable program costs. The proposed fee increase is not expected to negatively impact the participation level in any of the programs.

The existing fees, proposed new fees and anticipated participation numbers are listed on Exhibit A.
