NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP









Code Enforcement conducted a Neighborhood Clean-Up at Mesquite Rd. & Nisqually on Saturday October 15, 2016 between the hours of 9:00am and 3:00pm. During that time 76 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 34 tons of trash & debris and 3 tons of recyclables. Seventeen containers were utilized from Burrtec to collect the trash & debris and recyclables. Prior to the event, staff walked a designated area notifying residents of the upcoming clean up by handing out flyers. This program allows residents to remove potential blight issues voluntarily. This program is funded by a grant from Cal Recycle




13 P.O.P. Cases Were Opened Officers Responded to 93 Reactive Cases


GRAFFITI ABATEMENT PROGRAM

90% of the graffiti cases opened in October were opened proactively by officers.











COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

The Community **Enhancement Crew** consists of one part-time Community Enhancement Officer and multiple work release inmates from the San Bernardino County Jail. The Community **Enhancement Crew** removes illegal dumps from the desert when Code Officers cannot locate the individual(s) who dumped the items. They also assist with community enhancement events, Public Works, household hazardous waste and other functions throughout the town. The crew works on Saturday and Sunday.

16,920 pounds of trash and debris was collected in October.











CODE ENFORCEMENT SPOTLIGHT

MARIIUANA GROW

Code Enforcement received a complaint of a possible marijuana grow in a commercial complex on Pioneer Rd. Several attempts were made to contact the occupants of the unit to investigate the complaint. An occupant was eventually contacted at the location and refused to allow Code Enforcement officials into the building to inspect. An inspection warrant was obtained from the San Bernardino County Superior Court to inspect the interior of the property to determine if the building was in violation. On October 24th access to the property was obtained. Code Enforcement observed several items on the property that are commonly used to grow marijuana, along with reasonable suspicion to believe that alterations to the building were made without required permits. Investigators from the Sheriff's Marijuana Enforcement Team assisted Code Enforcement with serving the inspection warrant. Evidence was located that marijuana was being grown in the interior of the building. Over 500 marijuana plants were found growing at the location, along with several pounds of harvested marijuana. While at the commercial property, investigators identified three additional illegal marijuana cultivations within the same complex. Code Enforcement officers also inspected the property and found several building code violations. A case is being investigated by Code Enforcement, and the tenants and/or property owner were issued citations for the violations.
