#### The TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY PARK AND RECREATION COMMISSION MINUTES October 6, 2016

#### CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Patrick Doran called the meeting of the Park and Recreation Commission of the Town of Apple Valley to order at 6:01 p.m. in the Town Council Chambers.

#### ROLL CALL:

Roll call was taken with the following members present: Chairman Patrick Doran, Commissioner Jiles Smith, Commissioner Richard Cambridge and Commissioner Valerie Smith.

Absent: Vice-Chairman Donald Tatera

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Patrick Doran

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

#### 1. Approval of Minutes for Park and Recreation Commission Meeting

Commissioner, Valerie Smith, motioned to approve the minutes from August 4, 2016 and August 29, 2016. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Jiles Smith.

Motion carried by a 4-0-0-1 vote.

### 2. Approval of the Parks and Recreation Monthly Report for July and August

The July and August 2016 monthly reports were presented. Discussion ensued regarding participation numbers showing 0 on the Healthy Apple Valley page. Ralph Wright, Parks and Recreation Manager, explained to the commission that July was the beginning of our fiscal year and the participation numbers started over. He explained that not all events listed had happened yet and that is why it shows 0. Commissioner Smith felt that it did not look very good if the public had access to the Monthly reports. Mr. Wright advised that we would start only inputting the events that had already happened and that had participation numbers. Commissioner, Jiles Smith also discussed that it would be good to have the fiscal year printed on the front page of the Monthly Reports.

Commissioner Jiles Smith motioned to approve the Monthly Reports. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valerie Smith. Motion carried by a 4-0-0-1 vote.

### 3. Report on Summer Events

Ralph Wright, Parks and Recreation Manager, spoke to the Commission about the programs and events that had occurred in the past several months. Mr. Wright explained that PIO is not the only Department that handles large scale events and presented numerous events that the Recreation department had put on such as, The Gift of Sight, Poke-Thon, Reverse Triathlon, etc. Ralph discussed the First Annual Cardboard Boat Regatta and also showed the commission a video of the event. He continued by discussing the Gift of Sight event that gave eye exams and new refurbished glasses to approximately 300 residents. This event also provided 60 dental exams, frees hearing exams and 14 people signed up for phones. We also had over 110 volunteers at the event helping out with such a terrific cause.

Mr. Wright then discussed the Poke-Thon that our new rec assistant, Jonathan Settle started. It was held at Civic Center Park and hosted about 325 people. There were many adults and children looking for Pokemon characters throughout the park.

The last event presented was our Annual Reverse Triathlon, held on September 24, 2016. It was the most successful year with 468 participants and over 600 people in all at the park this day. The participants run a 5k, a 12 mile bike ride, and a 150 yard swim. Mr. Wright discussed the involvement with the Police Department, Code Enforcement, Kenny from PIO, Teen Zone volunteers, the help from user groups and the recreation department team, all coming together to help our with the event.

### 4. Update on Park Projects

Ralph Wright, Parks and Recreation Manager, discussed the current park projects that have been handled in recent months. The Chiller was installed at the Apple Valley Golf Course and there have been no problems reported with the air conditioning. The Ryan Cambridge Memorial flag pole was completed in October as well.

Mr. Wright informed the Commission of several upcoming projects that are planned, such as the restroom at Thunderbird Park that was approved by council. He stated that it should be up and running after the first of the year. Also, the Mendel Park project, which includes a basketball court, and a 30x30 slab with exercise equipment. Lastly, Mr. Wright informed the Commission that the lighting project for Field 8 was moving forward and should be completed prior to the start of the spring baseball season.

### 5. CDBG Projects

Ralph Wright, Parks and Recreation Manager, discussed recent projects that he would like to apply for. He stated that he would like to have a further discussion and make some decision on which projects to apply for at the December Commission meeting. The projects included a security camera system at James Woody Community Center, an extended sidewalk around James Woody, replacing the outdated playground at James Woody park, replacing the restroom at James Woody, near the basketball courts, installing a permanent restroom at Mendel park, trying to correct the wash out issue at Corwin park and also installing concrete curbing around the playground at Yucca Loma Park.

Chairman, Patrick Doran stated that he would like to see tennis courts at more of our facilities and Commissioner, Jiles Smith agreed, adding he would also like to see racquet ball courts as well. Mr. Wright discussed the staffing and attendant restraints that make that more difficult but also stated there is a possibility of tennis courts in the future at Civic Center Park.

#### PARKS AND RECREATION MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Wright updated the Commission the departments need for a new Recreation Management Software program. He explained that we currently have a program that will not be supported as of next year and we have had this program for 11 years. He also stated that it will increase our registrations by having online access.

Mr. Wright also informed the Commission of upcoming programs including the Day Camp and discussed the success that we had by changing the Cross Country meet to Horsemen's Center. He advised them of 98 participants this year and the expectation of 150 participants for the 2017 Cross Country Meet.

### PARK AND RECREATION COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Jiles Smith commented that he had recently gone to Brewster Park and had a discussion with the Seminoles. He stated that he toured the fields and noticed the significant difference in the front fields as opposed to the back field turf. He was curious why the poor quality of grass that the football team was using. Mr. Wright, advised Commissioner Smith that football does tear up the turf more than soccer due to consistent usage in a lined out area, however the main reason for the poor quality turf is due to the drought. We decreased the water substantially and after we started watering again, the park had 2 line breaks that severely affected the front turf at the park. Mr. Wright has addressed the issue with the Seminoles and will be working on the turf as soon as the user groups are not using the park daily.

#### SUGGESTED ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS

Mr. Wright advised the commission that future agenda items will include: Hilltop House update, CDBG list of project applications, Fiscal Year budget update and a CIP Plan.

In April 2012, the Town Council and staff participated in a workshop with Flint Strategies to review our progress on Vision 2020 ad revisit the goals of the document in light of the current economic climate. The Town Council approved the revisions to Vision 2020 on September 25, 2012.

Below are the revisions to Goal #5 Ample Parkland and Diverse Recreational Opportunities. Changes were made to section 5.1 to signify that the goal is to "maintain" current facilities and programs instead of the previous goal of expanding. Section 5.5 was removed because of the Master Plan Update.
