#### NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP





Code Enforcement conducted a Neighborhood Clean-Up at Central Rd. & Esaws on Saturday May 13, 2017, between the hours of 9:00am and 3:00pm. During that time, 76 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 27 tons of trash & debris and 1 ton of recyclables. Sixteen containers were utilized from Burrtec to collect the trash & debris and recyclables. Prior to the event, staff walked a designated area notifying residents of the upcoming clean up by handing out flyers. This program allows residents to remove potential blight issues voluntarily. This program is funded by a grant from Cal Recycle




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# GRAFFITI ABATEMENT PROGRAM

The Town of Apple Valley offers an exceptional graffiti removal service town wide. This free color matched removal program eliminates the eyesore of graffiti and preserves the integrity of existing surfaces.

39 graffiti cases were opened

74% of the graffiti cases opened in May were opened proactively by officers.












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### **COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM**

The Community **Enhancement Crew** consists of one part-time Community Enhancement Officer and multiple work release inmates from the San Bernardino County Jail. The Community **Enhancement Crew** removes illegal dumps from the desert when Code Officers cannot locate the individual(s) who dumped the items. They also assist with community enhancement events, Public Works, household hazardous waste and other functions throughout the town. The crew works on Saturday and Sunday.

11,440 pounds of trash and debris was collected in May.











#### **ILLEGAL DUMPING**

On April 5, 2017, Code Enforcement Officers responded to an easement in the 20000 block of Tonawanda on a complaint of an illegal dump. On the Officers arrival, he observed trash and household items illegally dumped down the entire easement. A check of the dump site yielded information related to the owner of the items. The Officer was able to make contact with the owner of the items and issued him a citation. Additionally, the subject recovered all items from the area. Then on April 14, 2017, Code Enforcement received a complaint about an illegal dump just east of Granite Hills High School. Mail information found in this dump had the name as the items recovered on Tonawanda. Officers contacted the subject again and had him recover the illegally dumped items from this location. On May 24, 2017, the subject appeared in court on this case and was fined \$350 plus \$211 cost recovery to the Town.

When filing a complaint, your name, address and phone number are required. This information remains confidential and is used only for the Code Enforcement Officer to contact you for additional information or to update you on the case.
