PUBLIC COMMENTS

Greg Sorenson, President, Liberty Utilities, stated that Liberty Utilities recently completed the purchase of Park Water Company and Apple Valley Ranchos Water Company (AVRWC). Mr. Sorenson confirmed that the transaction took place at the same time for Park Water Company, AVRWC and Mountain Water Company.

Mayor Stanton asked if there might be any changes in staffing for the former Apple Valley Ranchos Water Company.

Mr. Sorenson stated that Liberty Utilities Company has retained all of the former AVRWC employees.

TOWN MANAGER'S COMMENTS & LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Frank Robinson, Town Manager, introduced Mr. Greg Snyder the new Director of Public Works for the Town.

Mr. Robinson commented on AB1591, a transportation-funding bill to raise \$7 billion annually by increasing the gas excise tax by 22.5¢ and introduce a \$38 per vehicle license fee. In addition, it would add a \$165 new vehicle fee on zero emission vehicles since those users are no longer purchasing gasoline.

Mr. Robinson also stated that several elected officials are lobbying to introduce a bill that would enable the transfer of the Ontario International Airport back to the City of Ontario. The goal would be to restore that transportation hub back to the profitable airport that it once was. He announced that the Support Apple Valley Events Marketing Report would be delayed until February.
