PUBLIC COMMENTS

Katie Manning, Apple Valley, respectfully requested that Agenda Item No. 4A be pulled from the agenda and continued to the next meeting. She believed the Town does not have the right to sell reclaimed water.

Matthew Fairchild, Apple Valley, expressed concern regarding the need for sidewalks in the Town of Apple Valley.

Willie Beasley, Apple Valley, commented on the basketball courts at the Town of Apple Valley recreation facilities. He stated that the courts are in need of improvements and the outside facilities are very slippery. He felt this was a safety issue.

Jim Conkle, Apple Valley, presented a 1961 article in reference to buying the water company.

Tom Piper, Apple Valley, recommended that the Town of Apple Valley approve a patrolled secured drag street race in the community for residents interested in motorsports.

Cecil Volsch, Apple Valley, presented the Town Council with information regarding the HERO and PACE programs. He identified in the documents the actual cost that homeowners pay for the merchandise that they received which is significantly higher once the interest is compounded.

TOWN MANAGER'S COMMENTS & LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS AND BUSINESS

Frank Robinson, Town Manager discussed the importance of the Town Council's attendance in Washington, DC at meetings scheduled with the Department of Transportation and others to discuss TIGER grant funding to assist with completing the third arterial section of the Yucca Loma Bridge Project.

Mr. Robinson also commented on two (2) interstate ramps, which are currently being re-engineered at this time. For the next two (2) years he advised there will be some disruption in traffic flow and believes it will affect residents trying to get in and out of the area.

In addition, Mr. Robinson stated that some assembly bills staff is keeping an eye on are AB 21 which is medical marijuana cultivation licensing. The League of California Cities has announced their support for this bill. AB 26 is an additional medical cannabis bill which under the the Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act would deny an application if specified conditions are not met. AB 448 is local jurisdictions addressing property tax revenue allocations and vehicle license fee adjustments

Mayor Pro Tem Nassif announced that Council Member Cusack would be abstaining from one (1) or more of the closed session items as it pertained to Liberty Utilities if needed, due to a potential conflict of interest. He stated that his company does business with the above referenced company.

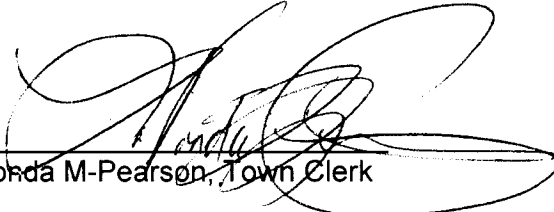

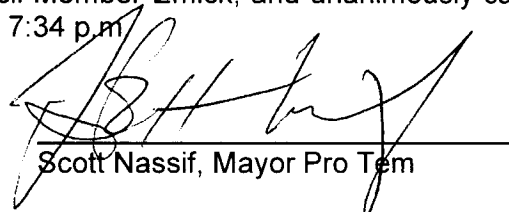
Upon returning from Closed Session at 7:33 p.m., Mayor Pro Tem Nassif announced that there was no reportable action taken.
