# Apple Valley welcomes new town manager

The Town of Apple Valley is pleased to welcome Frank W. Robinson as the new Town Manager. His first day was July 10. Robinson comes to us from The Woodlands Township, Texas, a community of 88,000 citizens located 30 miles north of Houston, where he served as the Township's Chief Administrative Officer for nearly 14 years.

With over twenty years of comprehensive executive level management experience in local government serving city councils and boards of directors, Robinson has a proven track record of leadership in public administration, economic development, tourism and community relations. He recently received the Credentialed Manager designation from ICMA, the premier local government leadership and management organization.

# Council adopts 2008-09 budget

The Town of Apple Valley is fortunate to have a legacy of conservative financial planning. Operating "lean and mean" is standard procedure for the town, so a little belt-tightening is having little to no effect on the service we provide our citizens.

The budget for 2008-09 is \$104 million across all funds, a

slight decrease from \$114 million last year. We will be spending down bond funding received for the construction of public facilities, including a new Animal Shelter and a Town Hall annex, as well as spending accumulated Measure I funds on the Yucca Loma Bridge project.


In public safety, two new deputies will be added. One will join the existing gang team which, along with a newly assigned sergeant, will double the personnel allocated to gang suppression. The other new deputy will serve as a retail officer, helping to curtail the crime associated with commercial centers by coordinating among businesses and with other cities.

The General Fund budget, which pays for public safety and general government expenses, as well as provides a subsidy to the Parks and Recreation fund, is \$20.2 million, up from \$19.4 million last year. In 2007, Apple Valley was one of only seven San Bernardino County cities showing any increase in sales tax revenue, and a 16% increase from 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2006 to 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2007 was the very highest in the county.



# Notice on medical sharps

Starting September 1, home-generated medical sharps such as syringes and lancets are no longer allowed in the trash. You can bring these sharps to the Town of Apple Valley Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) drop off on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of every month, but we also encourage you to check with your doctor's office or pharmacy to see if a sharps collection program has been developed inhouse.

# Recreation budget

trimmed

Since taking over parks and recreation in 2001, the Town has seen tremendous growth in services. The number of programs offered has nearly doubled, with a 365% increase in



participation! When we absorbed the special district, we also received its allocation of property tax, but have been adding to that with a general fund subsidy of as much as \$1.3 million last year. This year steps were taken to further contain costs and reverse the trend of a growing subsidy.

Overall, the parks and recreation budget for 2008-09 is \$3.6 million. The General Fund subsidy will be cut in half, from \$1.3 million down to \$667,000. Each program and line item in the recreation budget was examined with an eye towards efficiency and savings without sacrificing customer service. Some of the measures implemented include:

- The Recreation Office is no longer open on Saturdays, but still has extended weekday hours from 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- An increase in some program fees, especially in the adult sports area, to bring us in line with neighboring cities and eliminate program subsidies.
- Closure of three After School
  Activities Program sites (Rancho
  Verde, Sandia and Mojave Mesa), as
  each of these schools has begun their
  own programs.
- Closure of Ferrarese Park, adjacent to Vanguard Preparatory School. This park has been closed to the public for about two years and will be sold to the school district.

Some of the savings come just from a better estimation of expenses for the Civic Center Park and Aquatic Center which have now been in operation for a full year. Overall, the changes should hardly be noticeable to our residents. It continues to be our goal to meet the recreational needs of Apple Valley by "Creating Community Through People, Parks and Programs."


# Celebrating 20 years of town-hood
