Corridor Enhancement Plan for The Village. The 1.1 mile segment faces a number of transportation challenges related to the Outer Highway configuration and access to businesses from SR-18. We are looking for local input to help shape this Corridor Enhancement Plan and vision for The Village.

There are two upcoming opportunities for the residents of Apple Valley to provide input and learn more about the Corridor Enhancement Plan. Caltrans, Town staff, and plan consultants will be available to discuss the project with community members and listen to their ideas on May 8th at the Moose Lodge, located in the heart of The Village at 21955 CA SR-18; a second meeting will be held on October 30th at the Apple Valley Civic Center. In addition, there is an online survey which allows residents to provide input that will be used to shape the Corridor Enhancement Plan (see link and QR Code below).

- Study the existing transportation conditions, hazards, and collision data
- Involve stakeholders in workshops that help identify needs and desires
- Identify effective countermeasures to address deficiencies and hazards
- Conduct a benefit cost analysis to identify the most cost-effective countermeasures
