9. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Inclusion of Properties within the Town of Apple Valley in Various Open PACE Programs

Doug Robertson, Town Manager, presented the staff report as filed with the Town Clerk.

Jeff Simonetti, Renew PACE, commented on the PACE Program and the legislation that has been drafted to improve the program.

Jeremy Hutman, commented on the PACE program which offers homeowners a better way to manage their electrical bills. He distributed a document that outlined legislation on the program.

Dustin Reilich, Rennovate America, commented on the PACE program that allows veterans to make improvements to their properties. He spoke on working with legislators to ensure rules and regulations that will prove beneficial to both parties.

The Town Council asked questions regarding changes to the program as well as providing benefits to homeowners.

Cecil Volsch, Broker, noted that he was not against consumers having a choice. He stated that he has seen a change with the program and believed that an honest effort was being made to inform buyers of the legalities with these types of programs.

Council Member Stanton questioned the need to place sidewalks in this area when other areas of the Town in which she believed had more traffic, had a greater need for sidewalks. She questioned the funds used for this project. She indicated that she was not against the sidewalks; however, she wanted to ensure that the placement of the sidewalks provided the greatest good for the Town of Apple Valley.

Discussion ensued as to whether or not the accessibility project should be completed in this area.
