TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY TOWN COUNCIL – REGULAR MEETING MINUTES – August 26, 2008

OPENING CEREMONIES

CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Jasper called to order the meeting of the Apple Valley Town Council at 6:30 p.m.

Roll call was taken with the following members present:

Mayor Jasper with the consensus of the Town Council recommended that Closed Session be discussed at the end of the meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

William Furmage, Apple Valley, commented on the need for bicycle lanes on Bear Valley Road from Kiowa Road to Apple Valley Road.

Pat Hanson, Apple Valley, announced the First Annual Bike Ride that would be held on Saturday, October 18, 2008 in the Town. She stated that they believed this event would attract many individuals within the community.

Chuck Hanson, Apple Valley, commented on his success riding bicycles within the community. He spoke of the health benefits and exercise received from bicycling. He also thanked the Police Activities League for their assistance with the annual ride.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE/COMMISSION PARTICIPATION

Councilman Roelle commented on the success of the Mudfest Event held in Apple Valley by the Parks and Recreation Department.

Councilman Nassif thanked the Hanson's for their work on the bike ride. He also thanked Art Bishop for his assistance with them in coordinating this event. He stated that they anticipate over 500 riders for this event.

Mayor Pro Tem Sagona recommended that the route be published for the community's benefit.

Mayor Pro Tem Sagona stated that the Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District approved allocations from the Carl Moyer Program of \$13,323 for the City of Victorville and \$104,411 to Mitsubishi Cement. He spoke on the benefit of this program which provides funding for the incremental costs for cleaner vehicles and equipment.

Mayor Pro Tem Sagona also stated that the Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority approved the submittal of a Request for Proposal to deal with the odor issue at the south interceptor of Highway 18. He explained that this would be a joint RFP between VVWRA and the Town of Apple Valley.

Mayor Jasper stated that the ridership for the Victor Valley Transit Authority (VVTA) has increased 2% above last years figures.

Mayor Jasper opened the public hearing at 6:53 p.m.

Lori Lamson, Assistant Director of Community Development, presented the staff report as filed with the Town Clerk.

Councilman Roelle questioned whether or not this issue would come before the Town Council at a future time.

Ms. Lamson explained that the conditions would remain the same as they are currently listed.

William Grammenos, Apple Valley, expressed his concern regarding the lack of a requirement that would force the developer to place a retaining wall between the properties. He stated that if the owner is not required to place a retaining wall on

the property, that the individual owners of the property, once sold, would each place their own wall on the property resulting in various types of walls that would be visible on the side of his property.

Discussion ensued regarding the requirements as listed in the development code.

Mr. Grammenos reiterated that he would like continuity on the wall.

Craig Sanborn, Cubit Engineering, explained that the plan for this property was to create individual lots for sale. He stated that the planning condition pertaining to the wall has not changed.

There being no additional requests to speak, Mayor Jasper closed the public hearing at 7:12 p.m.
