FOUR-WAY STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF SITTING BULL ROAD AND IROQUOIS ROAD

Summary Statement:

On September 3, 2008, the Traffic Safety Committee met and evaluated the need for fourway STOP controls at the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road. The Committee concurred with the staff recommendation to establish the intersection as a fourway STOP. In addition, the Committee determined that rumble strips and flashers would be needed at this location. Attached is the staff report submitted to the Traffic Safety Committee for Council information.

Recommended Action:

Adopt Resolution 2008-55, "A Resolution of the Town Council of the Town of Apple Valley establishing the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road as a four-way STOP intersection."

Subject:	Four-way STOP sign installation at the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and
	Iroquois Road

Staff received a request from to investigate the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road to determine if a four-way stop is warranted. Currently there are STOP signs on the north and south legs of the intersection on Iroquois Road.

Staff performed a traffic engineering investigation which included an evaluation of past records of vehicle conflict, traffic volumes, and a field review of the intersection. Four-way STOP controls may be warranted if 1) the total volume of the major approach legs of the intersection average 210 vehicles per hour for the peak eight hours and 2) that for the same eight hour period the minor approach legs average a total of 140 vehicles per hour. Currently the average is 297 vehicles per hour for the major legs and 101 vehicles per hour for the minor legs.

State warrants also indicate that if 5 accidents occur in a 12 month period that may be susceptible to correction by placing additional stop signs, a four way stop may be justified. Between July 2007 and July 2008 there have been five (5) traffic collisions at this intersection, and five (5) collisions occurred where additional stop signs may be a correction measure.

Staff investigated other factors including surrounding geography, and intersection layout for clear sight views. Sitting Bull Road has a speed limit of 45 mph through this intersection. Approximately 300 feet west of this intersection is a hill that limits the amount of time a driver on Iroquois Road has to see oncoming traffic heading eastbound on Sitting Bull Road.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that four-way STOP controls be installed at the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road because the accident warrant has been met.





RESOLUTION NO. 2008-55

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY ESTABLISHING THE INTERSECTION OF SITTING BULL ROAD AND IROQUOIS ROAD AS A FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTION.

WHEREAS, a traffic engineering investigation has determined that establishing the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road as a four-way STOP intersection is warranted in accordance with Section 52.0111 of the San Bernardino County Code as adopted by the Town of Apple Valley.

NOW THEREFORE, THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY DOES RESOLVE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Approves and establishes the intersection of Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road as a four-way STOP intersection.

Section 2: Authorizes and directs the Town Manager to cause additional STOP signs to be placed on Sitting Bull Road and Iroquois Road.
