The Community Enhancement Crew consists of four full-time Community Enhancement staff members.

The Community Enhancement Crew proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with community enhancement events, Public Works, household hazardous waste and other functions throughout the town. The crew works Monday through Saturday.

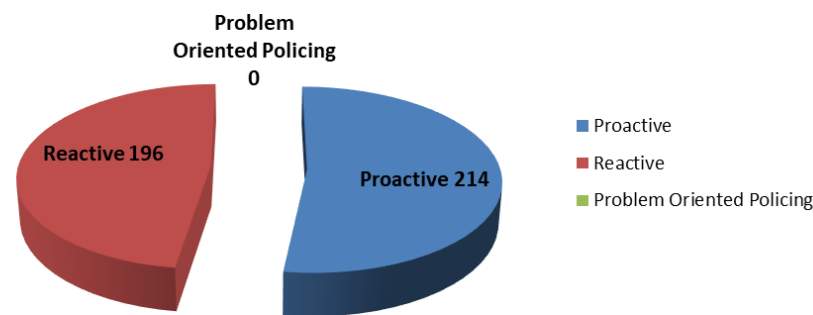
On Saturday, January 15, 2022, between the hours of 8:00am and 2:00pm, Code Enforcement staff hosted a Neighborhood Clean Up at Lion's Park. During that time, 199 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 47 tons of trash and debris, 2 tons of recyclables, and 3 tons of green waste. 8 front loader trash trucks were utilized from Burrtec to collect the trash and debris along with 2 bins for recyclables and 3 rear loaders for green waste.

Code Enforcement Spotlight

On September 10, 2021, Code Enforcement responded to a complaint of several recreational trailers on a vacant lot in the area of Mesquite Road and Bear Valley Road. When Officers arrived they observed the trailers. The property owner was contacted and advised the people were trespassing. Citations were issued to the occupants of the trailers. In January, the trailers were removed from the vacant lot, leaving trash and debris behind. The remaining trash was removed by the Community Enhancement Crew.



Did you know?

AVMC 11.80.020 - Inoperative vehicles prohibited.

It is unlawful for the owner or person in custody or control of an abandoned, wrecked, dismantled, or inoperative vehicle, or parts thereof, to allow it to remain on private or public property.
