

Community Enhancement Program

The Community Enhancement Crew consists of four full-time Community Enhancement staff members.

The Community Enhancement Crew proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with community enhancement events, Public Works, household hazardous waste and other functions throughout the town. The crew works Monday through Saturday.

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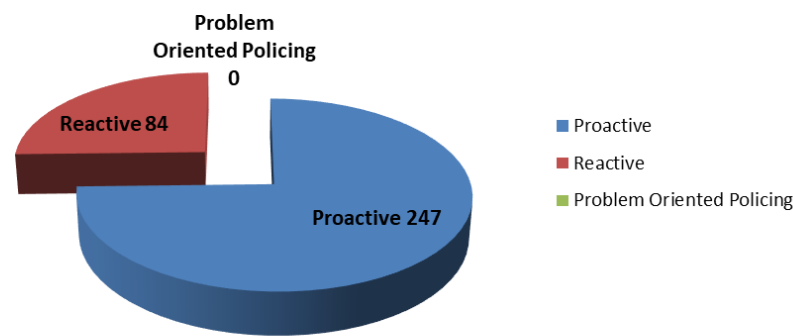
On Saturday, April 9, 2022, between the hours of 8:00am and 2:00pm, Code Enforcement staff assisted Parks and Recreation with a Community Cleanup at Lion's Park. During that time, 144 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 39 tons of trash and debris, 4 tons of recyclables, and 3 tons of green waste. 10 front loader trash trucks were utilized from Burrtec to collect the trash and debris along with 2 bins for recyclables and 3 rear loaders for green waste.

Code Enforcement Spotlight

On February 3, 2022, Officers responded to a complaint to people living out of a recreational vehicle and trash and debris scattered throughout a vacant lot on Caribou Road. On the Officers arrival they observed the motorhome and trash and debris on the vacant lot. A Notice of Violation was posted on the motorhome and sent to the property owner. On March 26, 2022 a follow up inspection was done and the violations had been abated.



Did you know?

AVMC 9.29.060(C)(9) Residential Use of Recreational Vehicles Prohibited.

A trailer, camper, fifth-wheel, recreational vehicle, bus, or similar vehicle may be used for temporary residential purpose, on a property for up to fifteen (15) days within any one (1) calendar year.
