The Community **Enhancement Crew** proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with Community Enhancement events, Public Works. Household Hazardous Waste and other functions throughout the Town. The crew works Monday through Saturday.

19,620 pounds of trash and debris was collected in July





Code Enforcement Spotlight

The Officer observed trash and debris throughout entire property and a red pickup truck with debris stored in the bed. The Officer contacted the property owner and issued a Notice of Violation. On the Officers follow up all violations had been abated.







AVMC 6.20.150(b) Illegal Dumping.

It is unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person to burn, bury, or dump solid waste, recyclables, and organic materials within the Town at any time unless a special permit for such burning, burial, or dumping has been issued pursuant to authority conferred by the Town Council or the agency providing fire protection services within the Town.
