



Code Enforcement Spotlight

On November 4, 2021, Code Enforcement Officers responded to a complaint of an occupied motor home and trash and debris in 16400 block of Chippewa Road. After issuing a Notice of Violation and several administrative citations to the property owner, a follow up was conducted on June 6, 2022, and all the violations had been abated.
