The Community Enhancement Crew proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with community enhancement events, Public Works, household hazardous waste and other functions throughout the town. The crew works Monday through Saturday.

On Saturday, March 7, 2022, between the hours of 8:00am and 2:00pm, Code Enforcement staff hosted a Neighborhood Clean Up at Lion's Park. During that time, 258 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 58 tons of trash and debris, 8 tons of recyclables, and 4 tons of green waste. 12 front loader trash trucks were utilized from Burrtec to collect the trash and debris along with 3 bins for recyclables and 3 rear loaders for green waste.

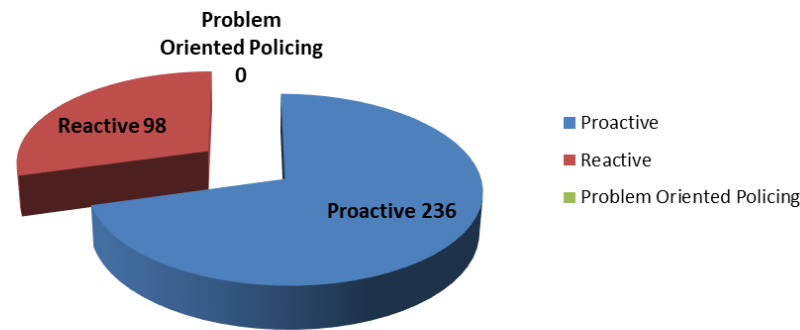

## Code Enforcement Spotlight

On March 21, 2022, Code Enforcement responded to the 14000 block of Dale Evans Parkway after being advised of a sewage spill from the grease interceptor the previous night. Public Works and Public Health assisted in determining the cause of the overflow. Due to the unsanitary conditions, Public Health shut the restaurant down and removed their A rating card. Officers made contact with the business owner who immediately contacted a plumbing company to service the line. The following morning the interceptor was pumped and Public Health restored the business' A rating and the business reopened.
