

Community Enhancement Program

The Community Enhancement Crew consists of four full-time Community Enhancement staff members.

The Community Enhancement Crew proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with Community Enhancement events, Public Works, Household Hazardous Waste and other functions throughout the Town. The crew works Monday through Saturday.

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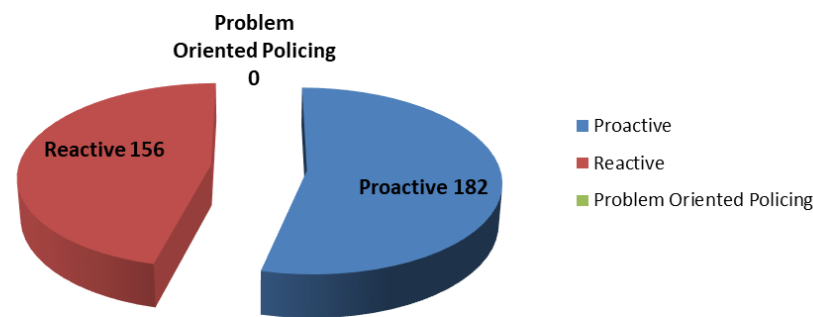
On Saturday, October 15, 2022, between the hours of 8:00am and 2:00pm, Community Enhancement staff hosted a Neighborhood Cleanup at Lion's Park. 200 citizens participated in the event bringing a total of 27 tons of trash and debris, 4 tons of recyclables, and 5 tons of green waste. 7 front loader trash trucks from Burrtec were used to collect the trash and debris along with 2 bins for recyclables and 2 bins for green waste.

Code Enforcement Spotlight

On July 28, 2022, Code Enforcement responded to the 13400 block of Kiowa Road for a complaint of trash and debris and prohibited fencing material attached to the fence. Upon the officer's arrival, they observed the trash and debris along the side of the residence and unapproved fencing material attached to the chain link fence. A Notice of Violation was sent to the property owner and tenant to bring the property into compliance. On October 3, 2022, an inspection was conducted and all violations had been abated.

AVMC 6.30.030 B. Hazardous Obstructions.

Any obstacle, landscaping or object reaching a height higher than 30 inches which obstructs the view of traffic is considered an obstruction.
