The Community Enhancement Crew consists of four full-time Community Enhancement staff members.

The Community Enhancement Crew proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with Community Enhancement events, Public Works, Household Hazardous Waste and other functions throughout the Town. The crew works Monday through Saturday.

18,496 pounds of trash and debris was collected in September

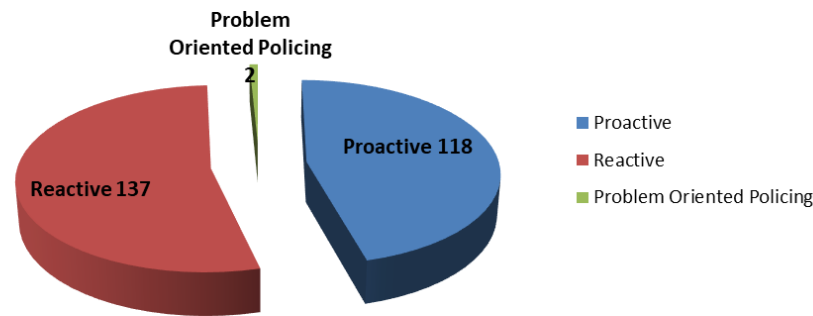
On Saturday, September 17, 2022, between 8:00am and 2:00pm, Code Enforcement and Parks and Recreation staff hosted a Community Cleanup at Lion's Park. Burrtec Waste Industries, Inc. provided 6 front loader trash trucks for trash and debris, 2 bins for recyclables, and 3 rear loaders for green waste. 126 residents participated by visiting the location and 18 tons of trash, 3 tons of recyclables, and 2 tons of green waste was collected.

Code Enforcement Spotlight

On June 20, 2019, Code Enforcement responded to the 20700 block of Thunderbird on a complaint of occupied recreational vehicles at the property. On the Officers arrival, they observed occupied recreational vehicles, trash and debris, dead vegetation, and inoperative vehicles. A Notice of Violation was sent to the property owner to bring the property into compliance. After multiple citations, an inspection was conducted on September 15, 2022 and all violations had been abated.

Did you know?

AVMC 6.30.030 F.(15)(e) Fence Maintenance.

Fences shall be maintained using approved fencing material. Approved screening material to shield, conceal or hide shall consist of solid block, stucco, wood slat fencing and chain link fencing with plastic, wood or metal inserts. Materials including, but not limited to, plywood, particleboard, garage doors, plastic tarps or canvas are prohibited screening materials.
