Community Enhancement Program

The Community Enhancement Crew consists of four full-time Community Enhancement staff members.

The Community Enhancement Crew proactively patrols and removes illegal dumps from the community.

They also assist with Community Enhancement events, Public Works, Household Hazardous Waste and other functions throughout the Town. The crew works Monday through Saturday. 23,082 pounds of trash and debris was collected in August















On Saturday, August 13, 2022, between the hours of 8:00am and 2:00pm, Code Enforcement staff hosted a Tire Amnesty Day at Lion's Park. Code Officers and the Community Enhancement Crew collected a total of 475 tires from 44 residents. Burrtec assisted by providing the dumpsters used to collect and dispose of the tires. The event is made possible using grant funds from CalRecycle.



Code Enforcement Spotlight

On December 16, 2021, the Code Enforcement Problem Oriented Policing Officer observed multiple violations at an apartment complex in the 20200 block of Zuni Road consisting of broken windows, inoperative vehicles, trash and debris and general dilapidation. A Notice of Violation was sent to the property owner. Over the next several months, Code Enforcement worked with the owner and property manager to bring the property into compliance. On August 1, 2022, a follow up inspection was conducted, and all violations had been abated.







AVMC 6.20.200(b) Inadequate Commercial Source Separation.

Every commercial business shall participate in the Town's four-container collection services by placing source separated food waste in brown or beige container, all source separated green material, landscape and pruning waste in green container, all recyclable materials in the blue container, and all remaining non-organic solid waste into the black container.
