REQUEST TO NAME A BALL FIELD AT THE JAMES WOODY PARK

Summary Statement:

A presentation was made by Councilman Bob Sagona at the Park and Recreation Commission Meeting on February 5, 2009 regarding a request to name a ball field at James Woody Park after Mr. Don Ferrarese. A Park Naming Committee originally selected and recommended naming a park after Don Ferrarese; however, that park has been locked since July 2005 and officially closed since June 2008 as part of the Park and Recreation Analysis. Mr. Ferrarese was a legendary major league ball player and his family has lived in the area for over 40 years.

The Park and Recreation Commission unanimously recommended approval of the request and recommended that this item be forwarded to the Town Council for approval.

Recommended Action:

That the Town Council approve the recommendation of the Park and Recreation Commission to name Field 1 at James Woody Park "Don Ferrarese Field" and authorize staff to place appropriate signage as needed.

About Don Ferrarese

Don Ferrarese, Married to Betty for 58 years, has called Apple Valley home for the past forty years.
