#### Subject Item:

AUTHORIZE EXECUTION OF NEW SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR ELECTRONIC WASTE RECYCLING WITH GOLD'N WEST SURPLUS. INC.

## **Summary Statement:**

In 2002, the Department of Toxic Substance Control identified cathode ray tube devices (CRTs) such as televisions and computer monitors as being too toxic to be disposed of in landfills. In response, the Town added CRTs to the items collected through its Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) program and provided free CRT recycling by obtaining a grant from the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB).

Subsequently, SB 20 and SB 50 enacted a program that collects an advance disposal fee from consumers purchasing CRTs. By becoming an "Authorized Collector" in 2004, the Town began receiving payment from its CRT recycler on a per pound basis for all CRTs. In 2008, the Town received over \$22,000 for 58 tons of CRTs which averages to about five tons per month.

On November 16, 2009, the Town released and published a Request for Proposal for Electronic Waste and Universal Waste recycling. Eight proposals were received which were reviewed and evaluated by staff. Recommendation is to accept the proposal of Gold'n West Surplus, Inc., and establish a contract with the company to recycle the electronic waste received through the Town's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center. This proposal increases the amount currently being paid to the Town for each pound of covered electronic waste collected and also begins paying the Town for other categories of miscellaneous electronics collected.

#### Recommended Action:

Authorize Mayor to execute the attached service agreement with Gold'n West Surplus, Inc., for recycling electronic waste received at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center.

## TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY SERVICES AGREEMENT

#### 1. PARTIES AND DATE.

This Agreement is made and entered into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2010, by and between the Town of Apple Valley, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of California with its principal place of business at 14955 Dale Evans Parkway, Apple Valley, California 92307 ("Town") and GOLD'N WEST SURPLUS, Inc., a corporation, with its principal place of business at 12155 Magnolia Avenue, #14, Riverside, CA 92503 ("Contractor"). Town and Contractor are sometimes individually referred to as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

#### 2. RECITALS.

#### 2.1 Contractor.

Contractor desires to perform and assume responsibility for the provision of certain professional services required by the Town on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement. Contractor represents that it is experienced in providing electronic waste collection and recycling services to public clients, is licensed in the State of California, and is familiar with the plans of Town

## 2.2 Project.

Town desires to engage Contractor to render appropriate transportation and recycling services for the electronic waste collected through the ongoing Town of Apple Valley Household Hazardous Waste Collection project ("Project") as set forth in this Agreement.

## 3. TERMS.

#### 3.1 Scope of Services and Term.

3.1.1 <u>General Scope of Services</u>. Contractor promises and agrees to furnish to the Town all labor, materials, tools, equipment, services, and incidental and customary work necessary to fully and adequately supply the safe collection, storage, transportation and recycling services necessary for the Project ("Services"). The Services are more particularly described in the Request for Proposal (Exhibit "A") and Contractor's proposal (Exhibit "B") attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. All Services shall be subject to, and performed in accordance with, this Agreement, the exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and all applicable local, state and federal laws, rules, and regulations.

3.1.2 <u>Term</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be from January 15, 2010, to January 14, 2012, unless earlier terminated as provided herein. Contractor shall complete the Services within the term of this Agreement, and shall meet any other established schedules and deadlines. The Parties may, by mutual, written consent, extend the term of this Agreement if necessary to complete the Services.

### 3.2 Responsibilities of Contractor.

- 3.2.1 Control and Payment of Subordinates; Independent Contractor. The Services shall be performed by Contractor or under its supervision. Contractor will determine the means, methods and details of performing the Services subject to the requirements of this Agreement. Town retains Contractor on an independent contractor basis and not as an employee. Contractor retains the right to perform similar or different services for others during the term of this Agreement. Any additional personnel performing the Services under this Agreement on behalf of Contractor shall also not be employees of Town and shall at all times be under Contractor's exclusive direction and control. Contractor shall pay all wages, salaries, and other amounts due such personnel in connection with their performance of Services under this Agreement and as required by law. Contractor shall be responsible for all reports and obligations respecting such additional personnel, including, but not limited to: social security taxes, income tax withholding, unemployment insurance, disability insurance, and workers' compensation insurance.
- 3.2.2 <u>Schedule of Services</u>. Contractor shall perform the Services expeditiously, within the term of this Agreement, and in accordance with the Schedule of Services set forth in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Contractor represents that it has the professional and technical personnel required to perform the Services in conformance with such conditions. In order to facilitate Contractor's conformance with the Schedule, Town shall respond to Contractor's submittals in a timely manner. Upon request of Town, Contractor shall provide a more detailed schedule of anticipated performance to meet the Schedule of Services.
- 3.2.3 <u>Conformance to Applicable Requirements</u>. All work prepared by Contractor shall be subject to the approval of Town.
- 3.2.4 <u>Town's Representative</u>. The Town hereby designates Diana McKeen, Environmental and Regulatory Compliance Manager or her designee, to act as its representative for the performance of this Agreement ("Town's Representative"). Town's Representative shall have the power to act on behalf of the Town for all purposes under this Contract. Contractor shall not accept direction or orders from any person other than the Town's Representative or his or her designee.
- 3.2.6 <u>Contractor's Representative</u>. Contractor hereby designates Gail Cordenis, or her designee, to act as its representative for the performance of this Agreement ("Contractor's Representative"). Contractor's Representative shall have full authority to represent and act on behalf of the Contractor for all purposes under this Agreement. The Contractor's Representative shall supervise and direct the Services, using her best skill and attention, and shall be responsible

for all means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures and for the satisfactory coordination of all portions of the Services under this Agreement.

- 3.2.7 <u>Coordination of Services</u>. Contractor agrees to work closely with Town staff in the performance of Services and shall be available to Town's staff, consultants and other staff at all reasonable times.
- 3.2.8 Standard of Care; Performance of Employees. Contractor shall perform all Services under this Agreement in a skillful and competent manner, consistent with the standards generally recognized as being employed by professionals in the same discipline in the State of California. Contractor represents and maintains that it is skilled in the professional calling necessary to perform the Services. Contractor warrants that all employees and sub consultants shall have sufficient skill and experience to perform the Services assigned to them. Finally, Contractor represents that it, its employees and sub consultants have all licenses, permits, qualifications and approvals of whatever nature that are legally required to perform the Services, including a Town Business License, and that such licenses and approvals shall be maintained throughout the term of this Agreement. As provided for in the indemnification provisions of this Agreement, Contractor shall perform, at its own cost and expense and without reimbursement from the Town, any services necessary to correct errors or omissions which are caused by the Contractor's failure to comply with the standard of care provided for herein. Any employee of the Contractor or its sub-consultants who is determined by the Town to be uncooperative, incompetent, a threat to the adequate or timely completion of the Project, a threat to the safety of persons or property, or any employee who fails or refuses to perform the Services in a manner acceptable to the Town, shall be promptly removed from the Project by the Contractor and shall not be re-employed to perform any of the Services or to work on the Project.
- 3.2.9 Laws and Regulations. Contractor shall keep itself fully informed of and in compliance with all local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations in any manner affecting the performance of the Project or the Services, including all Cal/OSHA requirements, and shall give all notices required by law. Contractor shall be liable for all violations of such laws and regulations in connection with Services. If the Contractor performs any work knowing it to be contrary to such laws, rules and regulations and without giving written notice to the Town, Contractor shall be solely responsible for all costs arising therefrom. Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold Town, its officials, directors, officers, employees, and agents free and harmless, pursuant to the indemnification provisions of this Agreement, from any claim or liability arising out of any failure or alleged failure to comply with such laws, rules or regulations.
- 3.2.9.1 <u>Labor Certification</u>. By its signature hereunder, Contractor certifies that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for Workers' Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that Code, and agrees to comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the Services.
- 3.2.9.2 <u>Equal Opportunity Employment</u>. Contractor represents that it is an equal opportunity employer and it shall not discriminate against any sub consultant, employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, handicap, ancestry,

marital status, sex, age or sexual orientation. Such non-discrimination shall include, but not be limited to, all activities related to initial employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination.

## 3.2.10 Insurance.

- 3.2.10.1 <u>Time for Compliance</u>. Contractor shall not commence Work under this Agreement until it has provided evidence satisfactory to the Town that it has secured all insurance required under this section. In addition, Contractor shall not allow any sub consultant to commence work on any subcontract until it has provided evidence satisfactory to the Town that the sub consultant has secured all insurance required under this section. Failure to provide and maintain all required insurance shall be grounds for the Town to terminate this Agreement for cause.
- 3.2.10.2 <u>Minimum Requirements</u>. Contractor shall, at its expense, procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the Agreement by the Contractor, its agents, representatives, employees or sub consultants. Contractor shall also require all of its sub consultants to procure and maintain the same insurance for the duration of the Agreement. Such insurance shall meet at least the following minimum levels of coverage:
- (A) <u>Minimum Scope of Insurance</u>. Coverage shall be at least as broad as the latest version of the following: (1) *General Liability*: Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence form CG 0001); (2) *Automobile Liability*: Insurance Services Office Business Auto Coverage form number CA 0001, code 1 (any auto); and (3) *Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability*: Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.
- (B) <u>Minimum Limits of Insurance</u>. Contractor shall maintain limits no less than: (1) *General Liability:* \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with general aggregate limit is used including, but not limited to, form CG 2503, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this Agreement/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit; (2) *Automobile Liability:* \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage; and (3) *Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability:* Workers' Compensation limits as required by the Labor Code of the State of California. Employer's Liability limits of \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
- 3.2.10.3 <u>Insurance Endorsements</u>. The insurance policies shall contain the following provisions, or Contractor shall provide endorsements on forms supplied or approved by the Town to add the following provisions to the insurance policies:
- (A) <u>General Liability</u>. The general liability policy shall be endorsed to state that: (1) the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be covered as additional insured with respect to the Work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor, including materials, parts or equipment furnished in

connection with such work; and (2) the insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers, or if excess, shall stand in an unbroken chain of coverage excess of the Contractor's scheduled underlying coverage. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not be called upon to contribute with it in any way.

- (B) <u>Automobile Liability</u>. The automobile liability policy shall be endorsed to state that: (1) the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be covered as additional insureds with respect to the ownership, operation, maintenance, use, loading or unloading of any auto owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Contractor or for which the Contractor is responsible; and (2) the insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers, or if excess, shall stand in an unbroken chain of coverage excess of the Contractor's scheduled underlying coverage. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not be called upon to contribute with it in any way.
- (C) <u>Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability</u> <u>Coverage</u>. The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers for losses paid under the terms of the insurance policy which arise from work performed by the Contractor.
- (D) <u>All Coverages</u>. Each insurance policy required by this Agreement shall be endorsed to state that: (A) coverage shall not be suspended, voided, reduced or canceled except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the Town; and (B) any failure to comply with reporting or other provisions of the policies, including breaches of warranties, shall not affect coverage provided to the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers.
- 3.2.10.4 <u>Separation of Insureds; No Special Limitations</u>. All insurance required by this Section shall contain standard separation of insureds provisions. In addition, such insurance shall not contain any special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers.
- 3.2.10.5 <u>Deductibles and Self-Insurance Retentions</u>. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Town. Contractor shall guarantee that, at the option of the Town, either: (1) the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers; or (2) the Contractor shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigation costs, claims, and administrative and defense expenses.
- 3.2.10.6 <u>Acceptability of Insurers</u>. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating no less than A:VIII, licensed to do business in California, and satisfactory to the Town.

- 3.2.10.7 <u>Verification of Coverage</u>. Contractor shall furnish Town with original certificates of insurance and endorsements effecting coverage required by this Agreement on forms satisfactory to the Town. The certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy shall be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf, and shall be on forms provided by the Town if requested. All certificates and endorsements must be received and approved by the Town before work commences. The Town reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, at any time.
- 3.2.10.8 <u>Reporting of Claims</u>. Contractor shall report to the Town, in addition to Contractor's insurer, any and all insurance claims submitted by Contractor in connection with the Services under this Agreement.
- 3.2.11 <u>Safety</u>. Contractor shall execute and maintain its work so as to avoid injury or damage to any person or property. In carrying out its Services, the Contractor shall at all times be in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations, and shall exercise all necessary precautions for the safety of employees appropriate to the nature of the work and the conditions under which the work is to be performed. Safety precautions as applicable shall include, but shall not be limited to: (A) adequate life protection and life saving equipment and procedures; (B) instructions in accident prevention for all employees and sub consultants, such as safe walkways, scaffolds, fall protection ladders, bridges, gang planks, confined space procedures, trenching and shoring, equipment and other safety devices, equipment and wearing apparel as are necessary or lawfully required to prevent accidents or injuries; and (C) adequate facilities for the proper inspection and maintenance of all safety measures.
- 3.2.12 Accounting Records. Contractor shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to all costs and expenses incurred under this Agreement. All such records shall be clearly identifiable. Contractor shall allow a representative of Town during normal business hours to examine, audit, and make transcripts or copies of such records and any other documents created pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor shall allow inspection of all work, data, documents, proceedings, and activities related to the Agreement for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement.

## **3.3** Fees and Payments.

- 3.3.1 <u>Compensation</u>. Town shall receive compensation, including authorized reimbursements, for all electronic waste collected under this Agreement at the rates set forth in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3.3.2 <u>Payment of Compensation</u>. Contractor shall submit to Town itemized reports which indicate tonnage of electronic waste collected by category and payment calculated to be made to the Town. The statement shall describe the amount of service provided since the initial commencement date, or since the end of the previous reporting period, as appropriate, through the date of the statement. Town shall receive, within 10 days of the date of each electronic waste collection by Contractor, the itemized report stating the specific tonnage of electronic waste collected, payment rate calculated, and a check or money order for same.

3.3.3 <u>Reimbursement for Expenses</u>. Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any expenses unless authorized in writing by Town.

## **3.4** Termination of Agreement.

- 3.4.1 <u>Grounds for Termination</u>. Town may, by written notice to Contractor, terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement at any time and without cause by giving written notice to Contractor of such termination, and specifying the effective date thereof, at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such termination. Upon termination, Contractor shall be compensated only for those Services which have been adequately rendered to Town, and Contractor shall be entitled to no further compensation. Either Party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause with 30 days' notice to the other party.
- 3.4.2 <u>Effect of Termination</u>. If this Agreement is terminated as provided herein, Town may require Contractor to provide all finished or unfinished Documents and Data and other information of any kind prepared by Contractor in connection with the performance of Services under this Agreement. Contractor shall be required to provide such document and other information within fifteen (15) days of the request.
- 3.4.3 <u>Additional Services</u>. In the event this Agreement is terminated in whole or in part as provided herein, Town may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it may determine appropriate, services similar to those terminated.

#### 3.5 General Provisions.

3.5.1 <u>Delivery of Notices</u>. All notices permitted or required under this Agreement shall be given to the respective Parties at the following address, or at such other address as the respective parties may provide in writing for this purpose:

Such notice shall be deemed made when personally delivered or when mailed, forty-eight (48) hours after deposit in the U.S. Mail, first class postage prepaid and addressed to the party at its applicable address. Actual notice shall be deemed adequate notice on the date actual notice occurred, regardless of the method of service.

## 3.5.2 <u>Indemnification</u>.

- 3.5.2.1 Scope of Indemnity. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold the Town, its directors, officials, officers, employees, volunteers and agents free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, costs, expenses, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death, in any manner arising out of, pertaining to, or incident to any alleged acts, errors or omissions of Contractor, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, consultants or agents in connection with the performance of the Contractor's Services, the Project or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages, expert witness fees and attorneys fees and other related costs and expenses. Notwithstanding the foregoing, to the extent Contractor's Services are subject to Civil Code Section 2782.8, the above indemnity shall be limited, to the extent required by Civil Code Section 2782.8, to claims that arise out of, pertain to, or relate to the negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct of the Contractor.
- 3.5.2.2 Additional Indemnity Obligations. Contractor shall defend, with Counsel approved by Town and at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, any and all claims, suits, actions or other proceedings of every kind covered by Section 3.5.2.1 that may be brought or instituted against Town or its directors, officials, officers, employees, volunteers and agents. Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against Town or its directors, officials, officers, employees, volunteers and agents as part of any such claim, suit, action or other proceeding. Contractor shall also reimburse Town for the cost of any settlement paid by Town or its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents or volunteers as part of any such claim, suit, action or other proceeding. Such reimbursement shall include payment for Town's attorney's fees and costs, including expert witness fees. Contractor shall reimburse Town and its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents, and/or volunteers, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided. Contractor's obligation to indemnify shall survive expiration or termination of this Agreement, and shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the Town, its directors, officials officers, employees, agents, or volunteers.
- 3.5.3 <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Venue shall be in San Bernardino County.
- 3.5.4 <u>Time of Essence</u>. Time is of the essence for each and every provision of this Agreement.
- 3.5.5 <u>Town's Right to Employ Other Contractors</u>. Town reserves right to employ other consultants or recycling contractors in connection with this Project.
- 3.5.6 <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement shall be binding on the successors and assigns of the Parties.
- 3.5.7 <u>Assignment or Transfer</u>. Contractor shall not assign, hypothecate or transfer, either directly or by operation of law, this Agreement or any interest herein without the prior written consent of the Town. Any attempt to do so shall be null and void, and any assignees, hypothecates or transferees shall acquire no right or interest by reason of such attempted assignment, hypothecation or transfer.

- 3.5.8 <u>Construction; References; Captions</u>. Since the Parties or their agents have participated fully in the preparation of this Agreement, the language of this Agreement shall be construed simply, according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against any Party. Any term referencing time, days or period for performance shall be deemed calendar days and not work days. All references to Contractor include all personnel, employees, agents, and sub consultants of Contractor, except as otherwise specified in this Agreement. All references to Town include its elected officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers except as otherwise specified in this Agreement. The captions of the various articles and paragraphs are for convenience and ease of reference only, and do not define, limit, augment, or describe the scope, content or intent of this Agreement.
- 3.5.9 <u>Amendment; Modification</u>. No supplement, modification or amendment of this Agreement shall be binding unless executed in writing and signed by both Parties.
- 3.5.10 <u>Waiver</u>. No waiver of any default shall constitute a waiver of any other default or breach, whether of the same or other covenant or condition. No waiver, benefit, privilege, or service voluntarily given or performed by a Party shall give the other Party any contractual rights by custom, estoppel or otherwise.
- 3.5.11 <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. There are no intended third party beneficiaries of any right or obligation assumed by the Parties.
- 3.5.12 <u>Invalidity</u>; <u>Severability</u>. If any portion of this Agreement is declared invalid, illegal, or otherwise unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
- 3.5.13 <u>Prohibited Interests</u>. Contractor maintains and warrants that it has not employed nor retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for Contractor, to solicit or secure this Agreement. Further, Contractor warrants that it has not paid nor has it agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for Contractor, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift or other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, Town shall have the right to rescind this Agreement without liability. For the term of this Agreement, no member, officer or employee of Town, during the term of his or her service with Town, shall have any direct interest in this Agreement, or obtain any present or anticipated material benefit arising therefrom.
- 3.5.14 <u>Cooperation; Further Acts</u>. The Parties shall fully cooperate with one another, and shall take any additional acts or sign any additional documents as may be necessary, appropriate or convenient to attain the purposes of this Agreement.
- 3.5.15 <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. If either Party commences an action against the other party, either legal, administrative or otherwise, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, the prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to have and recover from the losing party reasonable attorney's fees and all other costs of such action.

- 3.5.16 <u>Authority to Enter Agreement.</u> Contractor has all requisite power and authority to conduct its business and to execute, deliver, and perform the Agreement. Each Party warrants that the individuals who have signed this Agreement have the legal power, right, and authority to make this Agreement and bind each respective Party.
- 3.5.17 <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original.
- 3.5.18 <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior negotiations, understandings or agreements. This Agreement may only be modified by a writing signed by both parties.
