To avoid impacts to nesting birds (common and special status) during the nesting season, a qualified Avian Biologist retained by the Project applicant will conduct pre-construction Nesting Bird Surveys (NBS) within 3 days prior to Project-related disturbance to nestable vegetation to identify any active nests. If no active nests are found, no further action will be required.
